Choice of the destination and courses:

Courses attended

Course 1:

Judgment and Managerial Decision Making - Social science about different biases. Lectures and reading at home/heavy workload/textbook and articles/group presentation, active participation, Kahoot games, attendance and group members rating of you(!)

Course 2:

Social Media and Social Network Analysis - Downloading Twitter data and analyzing it in R. Lectures and home projects/ moderately / no literature /presentation, project.

Course 3:

Introduction to Field Geology (II) - Weekend trip to south of Taiwan to study rocks and geology. We had a Swedish teacher! Field trips and reading/ light to moderately/ textbook / Attendance, homework and exam.

Course 4:

Exploring Taiwan: natural environment and resources - Guest lectures about the nature in Taiwan. Lectures and field trips / light / no literature / Quiz and exam.

Course 5:

Tennis and swimming (different courses). Practice tennis and swimming / light / no literature / final and midterm exam. They only speak Chinese in these courses!

Additional Courses:
