Annette Markham is one of the world's leading scholars on innovative methods and ethics for researching digitally-saturated contexts. Her ethnographic studies of digital culture focus on how people make sense of digital technologies and datafication of their everyday lives. She conducts participatory research within critical pedagogical frameworks as well as traditional qualitative studies of user environments. Markham also has a longstanding applied background in hybrid and online educational technology design and teaching methods. Annette currently is co-director of the Digital Ethnography Research Centre at RMIT University in Melbourne, Professor (on leave) in the Department of Information Studies and Digital Design at Aarhus University, and founder and director of the Skagen Institute, which has hosted an annual writing retreat and PhD course on Transgressive Methods.
