UID24 | Design Talks & Degree Show

Head of Institute, Demian Horst, talked about initial preparations for UID24 | Design Talks & Degree Show, taking place on May 28-29, 2024. Next steps include a first meeting with graduating students (week 8), the setup of the 'UID24 Talent Pool', and the sending out of invitations, as well as website updates (end of February).

Taking care of each other

Pertaining to a recent incident, Demian Horst urged students to be extra watchful and keep an eye on the outside doors as they close. Students were encouraged, when letting a "stranger" in, to say hi to the person and ask if they need any help, and in case they see someone looking lost inside the building, to ask if they need help finding their way. When necessary, students should call Umeå University security (090-786 76 00) anytime they suspect the school is (or has been) at risk. This number can also be found on stickers all around the building.

It was stressed that we, staff and students, are not taking care of each other when we leave dirty dishes around the school, leave behind materials in our shared spaces, or when we leave unidentified material in the assembly rooms at the workshop. Help is needed. From everyone to create a respectful school environment.

Demian Horst reminded students of the "code of conduct" for the notice boards at UID that was presented during last semester. The "code of conduct" for UID notice boards emphasizes respect, relevance, and shared responsibility. It mandates that all content should be respectful and relevant to our community.

A quick anonymous survey was held on the current stress levels among students and what we can do to help each other. A majority of students felt a moderate level of stress during the past month. Students also gave an update on what is keeping them busy at the moment. Thesis and portfolio work was named as the things that preoccupied most students.

Work Environment

Representatives from the Student Health Services at Umeå University introduced the various avenues of assistance that they can offer to students. The Student Health Services' support activities are available to all students, and all services are free of charge. The support includes study guidance, support for students with disabilities and health services. When it comes to study guidance, UmU has study counsellors ready to help students with different procedures relating to applications and eligibility. The support for students with disabilities are available to a host of different groups of people with permanent disabilities. The Student Health Services offer help with relationships, lifestyle issues, stress, sleep, alcohol habits. Help is offered via lectures, counselling, drop-ins.

A representative from the UmU campus chaplaincy spoke about the services that they offer. Their aim is to give support, balance and inspiration. All talks with chaplaincy representatives are confidential. Appointments can be booked via the chaplaincy website. Every semester, silent retreats are organised by the chaplaincy. They are open to everyone and can be booked via the website. The chaplaincy also has a choir where anyone can join. Their offices are in the Natural Sciences Building.
