Style and Conventions

Manuscripts should be submitted online in Microsoft Word Format (.docx). In case of proposals using symbols (e.g., phonetic transcriptions), you are kindly requested to add a PDF version in addition. You can download and use this template).

All contributions are anonymous. Please name your contribution as follows: TITLE OF THE ABSTRACT CATEGORY X EURAU26 (make sure that no name appears in the submission format)

The first page will act as the cover. In this page, the authors must present the title, subtitle and the extended abstract in English. All this information may not exceed the length of 1200 words.

The extended abstract will be written in Times New Roman 10, with simple line spacing and indented. Bold or italic can be used, although it is preferable to use italics instead of bold to emphasize. Capitals words will be avoided in both the titles and the text.

The use of hyphens will be preferred to the use of parentheses.

Dates should be in the form of 'day month year', e.g., 05 October 2025. When using abbreviations or acronyms, spell them out in full on their first use (except for universally known ones such as UK, USA, UN, etc.). Do not use full points within abbreviations or acronyms.

Language

Only extended abstracts in English will be accepted.

Length

The length of the extended abstracts will be 1200 words, including title, notes and references.

Margins

The margins to be used are the ones of this template: 3 cm upper, 3 cm lower, 3 cm left and 3 cm right; and complete justification.

Paragraph titles

Use the Paragraph titles if needed. Paragraph titles will be written in Times New Roman 10, italic, with capital letters, and they should be aligned to the left, without indentation and with decimal numeration.

Notes

They will be included as footnotes. Written in Times New Roman 8, single line spacing, without indentation and

numbered starting at 1. In the body of the text, superscripts¹ will be used to reference the notes.

Enumerations

Authors should use only hyphens, which will be of different sizes if there are several levels.

- First level of enumeration.
- Second level of enumeration.

Bibliography

It will be included at the end of the extended abstracts, written in Times New Roman, size 10, with simple line spacing and without indentation. The references will appear in alphabetical order at the end of the extended abstracts. For all references formats will be used the international standard ISO 690.

<u>Instructions for Bibliographical References:</u>

Specific pages should be used for all the quotation.

Surname of the first author should be written in small caps.

Leave page number in full for both in text-citations and for pages in the works cited (e.g., Nilsson 2000, 115-126). Do not use abbreviated forms, as in 115-26.

Do not use Latin reference tags (op. cit., ibidem, etc.).

Use initialisms to indicate that some information is not available:

- (n.p.) for 'no publisher', 'no place of publication' or 'no page'.
- (n.d.) for 'no date'.

The names of publishers or publishing company names will be as much abbreviated as possible: avoid using 'Co.' or 'Inc.' and descriptive words (Publishing, etc.). The words 'university' and 'press' will be abbreviated in any of the corresponding forms: U of Chicago P or Oxford UP.

The full names of authors will be provided.

If any of the author-date cases of citation are not listed here, please check the <u>guide of help for the norm ISO 690</u> (PDF).

Submission Preparation Checklist

- All the personal information regarding authorship should be provided when registering on the platform to make a submission: title of the manuscript; authorship (author and EACH of the co-authors); institutional affiliation, full institutional address, including ORCID identifier and e-mail address.
