Umeå University is one of the leading comprehensive universities in Sweden. Our Creative environments attract students, researchers, teachers and collaborating partners nationally and globally. Our Master's programmes are normally two years of full-time studies. If not, it's stated above.

English language requirements

For Bachelor's and most Master's programmes, applicants must demonstrate English proficiency equivalent to the Swedish upper secondary course English 6.

This requirement can be met through:

- a required score on an internationally recognised English test; or
- completion of upper secondary or university studies in certain countries.

Master's programmes

General entry requirements

A Bachelor's degree of at least 180 ECTS (equivalent to a Swedish kandidatexamen) from an internationally recognised university.

Specific entry requirements for Masters programmes

Many Master's programmes also have further requirements, for example, a Bachelor's degree in a specific field of study or courses in certain subject areas. The entry requirements are specified on the programme's webpage.

Bachelor's programmes

General entry requirements

A completed upper-secondary (high school) education (post-16).

Applicants who received their final school grades after 31 December 2009 must also meet an additional mathematics requirement: successful completion of courses equivalent to Swedish courses Mathematics 1a, 1b, or 1c.

Specific entry requirements for Bachelor's programmes

Most Bachelor's programmes have specific entry requirements often related to the field of study. The entry requirements are specified on the programme's webpage.

Important dates

First admissions round for all students



Second admissions round for EU, EEA and Swiss citizens

EU, EEA and Swiss citizens do not need to apply for residence permits, and can therefore also apply in the second admissions round.



Please note that some programmes have their own application deadlines, which may differ from the general ones listed above.

Swedish study system

The academic year in Sweden is divided into two semesters: autumn and spring. Courses are taught with a variety of methods; lectures, lab work, discussion seminars, group or individual assignments. Sweden regularly ranks as one of the top countries in the world for non-native speakers of English which means you don't have to speak Swedish to study here.

Teaching styles

The teaching methods often requires that the students are active in the learning process and take responsibility for their own studies. Examinations can require that you summarise, evaluate and analyse to draw your own conclusions instead of short answers directly from a text book.

Ask questions and debate

The academic lifestyle is relaxed and friendly with an informal dress code. The relationship between staff and students is non-authoritarian and democratic - the professors are addressed by their first names. Asking questions and debate is norm.

Learn skills for a global career

Sweden ranks among the world's most innovative nations. During your studies you will learn to be creative, how to combine theory and practice, and how to navigate complex situations. You will also learn how to bring out the best in everyone and solve complex issues as a team – vital skills for your global career.

Focus on one thing at a time

You generally only take one course at a time. One full week of study is estimated to be approximately 40 hours of lectures, group work, seminars and self-study. Exams are not given at the end of the semester, but rather at the end of each course.

Tuition fees and scholarships

In general, citizens of countries outside of the European Union (EU), European Economic Area (EEA) and Switzerland are required to pay tuition fees for their studies in Sweden. Each year, Umeå University offers scholarships to talented and high-achieving students.

Tuition fees

With a few exceptions, citizens of countries outside of the European Union (EU), European Economic Area (EEA) and Switzerland are required to pay application and tuition fees for education at Swedish universities.

The tuition rates for full-time studies range from SEK 96,600 per year to SEK 395,700 per year, depending on the field of study.

Scholarships

Umeå University offers scholarships to academically talented and high-achieving students in conjunction with the first admissions round for the autumn semester. Selected candidates receive a full or partial tuition fee waiver.

Additionally, we cooperate with the Swedish Institute regarding their scholarship programmes. Scholarship opportunities can be found on their website.







Student housing

Umeå University Accommodation Service offers student housing to exchange students and tuition fee-paying students. Both Swedish and international students live in the student corridors.

Single-occupancy

A student corridor is usually comprised of 6-10 single-occupancy rooms with a shared kitchen and a common room. All rooms have a bathroom and most of the rooms have a shower.

Close to campus

Housing areas are within 20 minutes walking distance or 10 minutes bicycle distance of campus.

Furnished

Furnished with: a bed with mattress, duvet and pillow, desk, desk chair, bookcase, drawers and wardrobe.

Internet included

Internet is included in the rent (you need a LAN cable or a wi-fi-router). On campus you have free access to wi-fi.

*Please note that this is an average monthly budget for living in Sweden as a student. The cost of living is generally slightly lower in Umeå. For example a single room in Umeå costs around SEK 4,400 per month.

Students applying for a residence permit to Sweden need to present a bank statement showing they have the sufficient funds to support themselves during their study period.
